Ladies, Have You Heard? . . .

Preparing food for the family during the hot summer months can become a chore for the most efficient and dedicated homemakers. Why not lighten this burden by planning, preparing and freezing foods ahead of time

Freezing precooked foods helps distribute the work load. You can prepare some foods such as cookies and baked breads and rolls, in double or triple recipes to economize on time

It takes only twice as long to prepare as many as 10 dozen rolls from the oven to the freezer as it does to prepare one dozen. You can plan to cook larger amount of soups, stews, chili con carne, and spaghetti than you will need for a meal. Then freeze the extra for later use

Freezing preserves the precooked food as it is, so use good quality foods and ingredients. Freezing will not improve a poor product. Quality depends on freezing the ingredients at the right stage for eating, using correct proportions, careful handling, good sanitation practices, and proper packaging in moisture-vapor resistant material

To save casserole containers, line them with aluminum freezer foil and put the cooked mixture into them. Freeze, then remove the foil-filled casseroles, fasten the foil securely, the return the foil-wrapped package to the

freezer. A piece of stockinette or plastic bag, or other material over the foil will prevent it from being punctured during storage

And when you are ready to serve the food, just place the foil wrapped package back in the original container and reheat

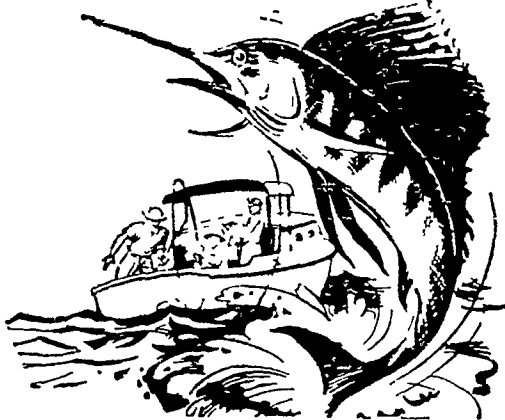

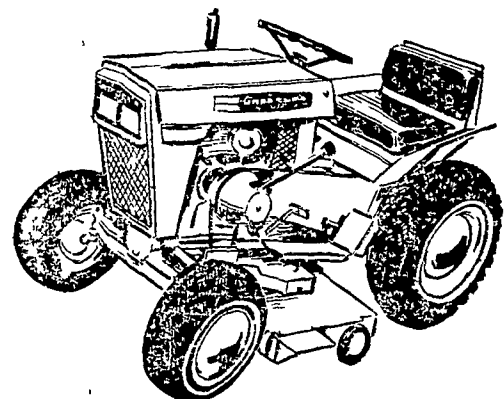
