Several organisms capable of causing acute latal mastitis are commonly found in muddy manure contaminated water These may be able to enter the teat canal and kill the cow in a matter of hours

Danymen should provide shade or guide the cows into the bain during the hottest part of the day When cows go wading they soon turn the wading pool into a health hazard




