CATTLE—Compared with last week's close, Slaughter Steers and Heifers 75-100 higher, except Standard and Low Good Steers steady to 50 higher, Cows mostly 25 higher, Bulls 50 higher.

Receipts 75 percent Slaughter Steers, 21 percent Heifers, the balance mainly Cows, overall finish of Slaughter Steers 18 percent Prime and 75 percent Choice. This compares with 25 percent Prime and 66 percent Choice last week and 26 percent Prime and 63 percent Choice last year. Average cost and weight of Slaughter Steers estimated at 31 25 highest in 10 weeks, and 1190 lbs compares with 30 71 and 1196 lbs last week and 32 98 and 1172 lbs last year. 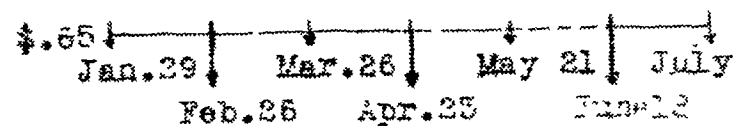
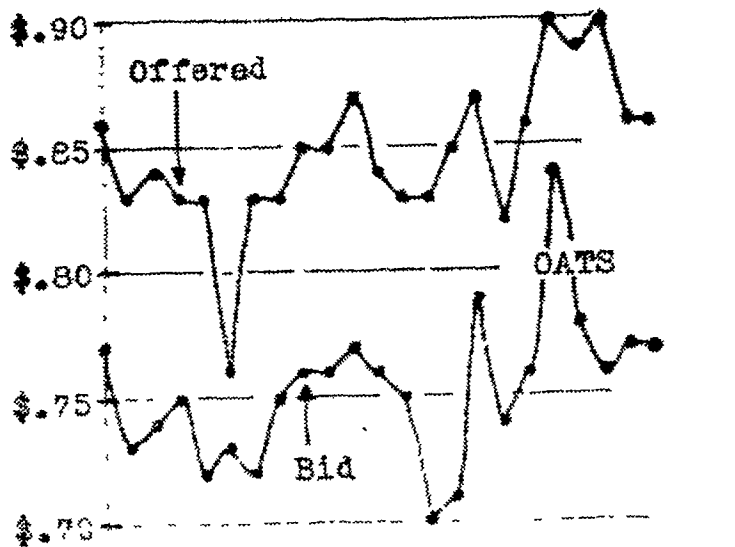
