**CATTLE** — Compared with last Friday slaughter steers uneven with average Good to Prime mostly steady, except weightover 1300 lbs steady to 25 lower. Standard and Low Good Holstein steers 50 75 lower. Slaughter heifers 50 1 00 lower. Cows strong to 25 higher. Bulls steady.

Receipts included 72 percent slaughter steers and 24 percent heifers with the balance mostly cows. Overall finish slaughter steers 25 percent Prime and 65 percent Choice, compared with 28 percent Prime and 72 percent Choice last week and 21 percent Prime and 64 percent Choice last year. Average cost and weight slaughter steers estimated at 31 15 and 1175 lbs compared with 31 12 and 1184 lbs last week and 33 05 and 1169 lbs last year. Heifer supply mostly High Good to Low Prime weighing 800 1050 lb in creased marketing of 800-900 lb heifers apparent and average weight expected to be near 910 lbs lightest since last September.

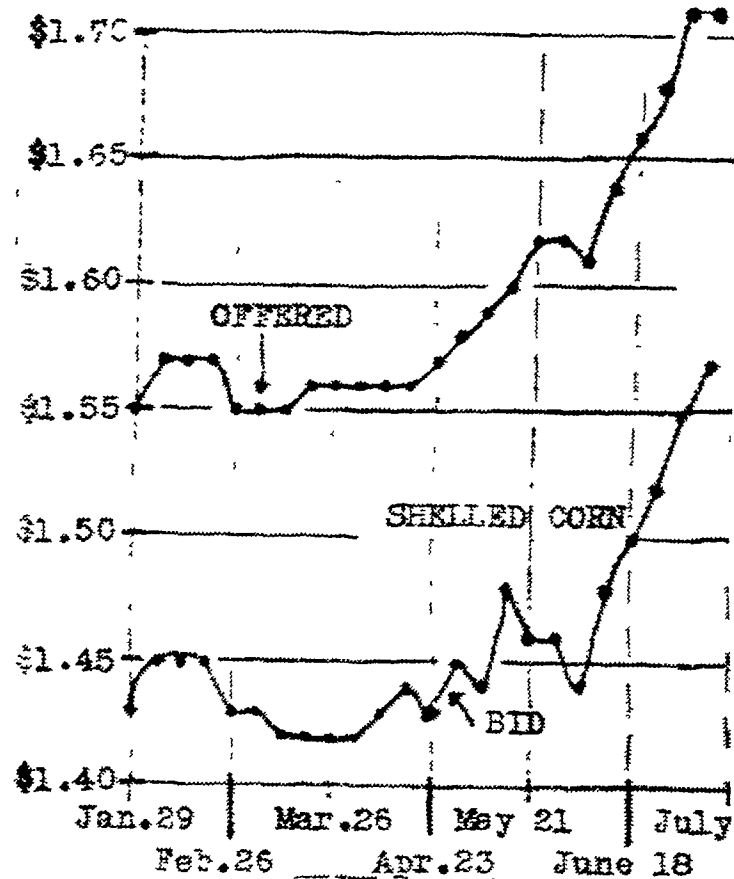
