**4 Sheepmen Included In Ram and Ewe Sale**

Lancaster County was slated to be represented by four sheepmen at the 22nd annual Keystone Stud Ram and Ewe Sale Friday and today (Saturday)

Max Smith, county agent, termed the sale a "good source of breeding animals" since "some of the best flocks in the East" will be represented

The local entries included Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Brubaker, 2418 Harrisburg Pike, with six sheep, H. J. Showalter, 109 Fulton St., Akron, with six animals, and Robert R. Buch, Ephrata with two. All three are entering Hampshire. The fourth county entry, Mr. and Mrs. Robert D.

Herr, of Narvon RD2, will have two Dorsets in the contest

Joseph P. Wentz, Atglen area, will enter three Suffolks

Milton K. Morgan, of 1916 New Holland Pike, well known Lancaster County sheepman, again serves as sales manager

Judge will be Warren C. Squires, of Chesterville, Ohio, and the auctioneer will be Col. Hobart Fathing of Findlay, Ohio

The first annual Keystone Wether Lamb Sale also will be held

Weights on the sheep will range from 35 pounds to 65 pounds, ideal weights for 4 H and FFA lamb projects

Chairman of the wethers sale is Robert D. Herr, Narvon RD2

**Co. Wheat Allotment Drops 10,000 Acres**

Lancaster County has received a wheat allotment of 33,892 acres for 1971. This compares with a 1970 allotment of 43,526 acres in 1970.

The allotment has been reduced by nearly 10,000 acres because of loss of wheat history to the county in 1970, according to Miss Dorothy Y. Neel, local Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service director

Until 1968, each farm received the farm allotment as history acreage each year. Beginning in 1968, only those farms that planted at least 75 per cent of the allotment in the current, or one of the two preceding years, received the allotment as history credit. Those that did not plant at least 75 per cent of the allotment in one of these three years, received the current year planted acreage as credit

Farmers are sent cards each year for reporting the planted wheat acreage. If after a reminder notice the cards are not returned, the planted acreage is recorded as zero on the farm record card

Regulations require that any farm with zero wheat history in 1968, 1969 and 1970 will receive a "zero" allotment notice in 1971

They will also receive a letter advising them of the opportunity to appeal. If they can prove to the satisfaction of the County ASC Committee the acreage of wheat grown in 1970, the allotment will be recomputed on the same basis as farms that reported acreage

At present, 2,178 farms will be dropped either because wheat has not been grown or the acreage has not been reported. The 1971 Allotment on these farms totals 7900 acres

Farms that grew 75 per cent of the allotment in either 1968, 1969 or 1970 will receive a very small reduction from last year's allotment, (97.7 per cent of the 1970 allotment)

O. C. Lange, farm services coordinator, will speak on "What's New." He will cover electric garden tractor, all-electric poultry housing, the super 55 water heater, and water purification

Quentin H. Smith, environmental development director, will speak on "Power Supply and the Environment"

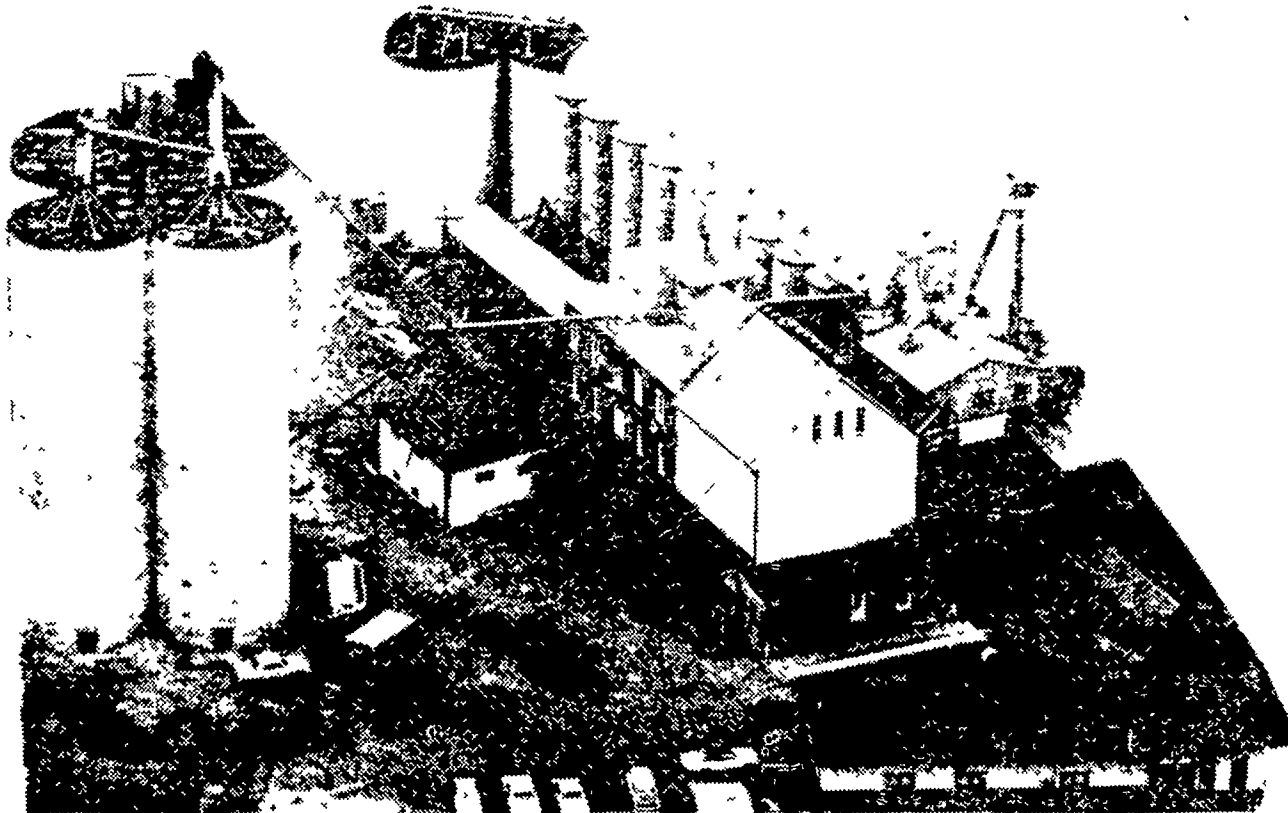
