## Animal By-Product Use

Food technologists have developed a process to convert animal by-products into edible meat protein concentrate for human consumption.

The high quality, tasteless, odorless product is made from liver, spleen, heart, stomach, kidney, viscera, blood, bone.

Analyzed at 75 to 80 per cent protein, it would effectively supplement cereal grain diet of many of the world's malnourished. Similar fish protein supplement already is in use.

Animal by-products would add greatly to availability of much-needed protein. An estimated 16 billion pounds of such products are now used for animal feed and could be processed for human consumption.

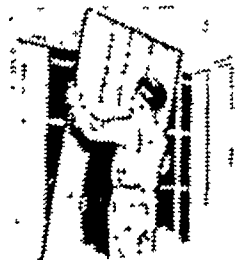
