Receipts consisted of 77 percent Slaughter Steers, 20 percent Heifers with the balance mainly Cows Overall finish of Slaughter Steers not as attractive as last week with 20 percent Prime and 70 percent Choice This compares with 26 percent Prime and 62 percent Choice last week and 22 percent Prime and 66 percent Choice last year Average cost and weight of Slaughter Steers, estimated at 31.55, highest in 12 weeks, and 1185 lbs compared with 31.10 and 1171 lbs last week, and 31.84 and 1161 lbs. 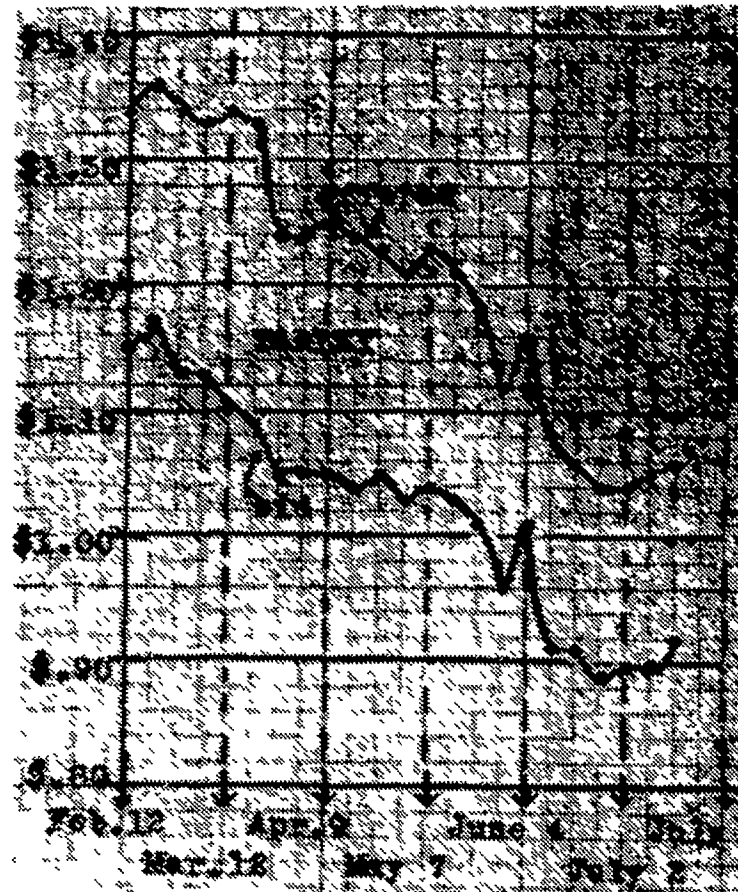
