## Delmarva

Ready-to-cook movement fair though continues very competitive in some quarters. Cull on US Grade A generally good with unfilled needs for future activity occasionally reported. Less than-trucklot prices generally unchanged on both Plant and US Grade A. Advance interest continues slow in developing overall. Live supplies remain ample despite continued heavy slaughter schedules. Unlabeled barely steady.

Pool trucklot prices for Thursday arrival at terminal markets: US Grade A 28-29 Mostly 28 1/2; Plant Grade 27-27 1/2. Several packs including 1 1/4-2, 3 1/2 sizes Tiewt.

## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

Prices of light type hens continued to hold unchanged, though in instances unconfirmed reports indicate slightly higher prices being paid. Demand fairly good with processors in instances working short schedules due to lack of birds. Farm offerings generally short of needs as producers trend to hold hens on farms for continued use. Prices offered for a limited process. Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens 5 1/2-8 mostly 7 1/4-8 in Pennsylvania mostly 6 1/2-8 in New Jersey. Heavy Type Hens flew.
