Jay Landis, president of the county Holstein Assn., expressed delight with the scores compiled by the youthful competitors, and joked about Balmer's win because of the friendly competition between Holstein and Guernsey breeders.

Balmer's score is a feat that hasn't been duplicated in the county in a number of years. He has been one of the county's top 4-H judges however, and is on the 4-H judging team.
