

Good Animals at B&W Grand Opening Draw Large Crowd



This is how a top-notch Holstein udder looks according to bidders at the Black & White Holstein Farm recently, who paid \$8,750 for this animal.

The grand opening of the new section of the Black & White Holstein Farm barn was reported a rousing success with the sale of 156 Holstein cows, heifers and calves Friday, July 17.

The top 50 cows sold for an average of more than \$1,300 each, while the entire 100 cows averaged \$975.75, according to sale officials. Including the remaining 56 calves and heifers, the average was still better than \$800 each, it was reported.

The top animal was C Coldspring Lassie Faye (EX-91), a four year and 11 month old cow bought by Gordon Wood of Mansfield, Pa. for \$8,750.

This cow produced 19,616 pounds of milk in her first lactation of 341 days and 22,166 in her second 313 day lactation. She has already produced 9,778 pounds of milk including 335 pounds of butterfat in the first 100 days of the third lactation.

She is the daughter of Lassie Leader and Coldspring Maple Anne.

A large turnout for the sale more than filled the sales arena. The turnout was estimated at between 500 and 1,000 persons.

During the sale, Charles C. Myers, farm owner, said he had gone all-out to bring in top animals for the sale.

This week, Myers was on the road — looking for animals to refill his barn.
