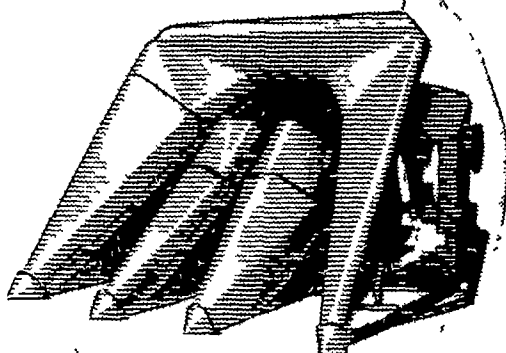
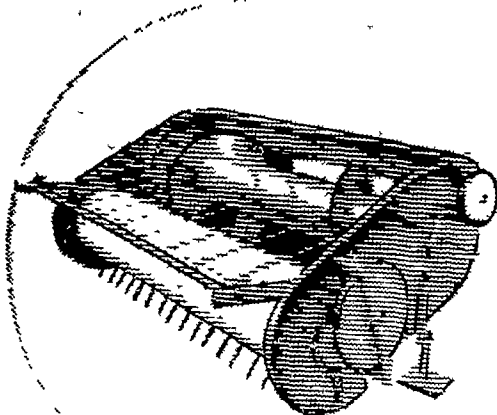
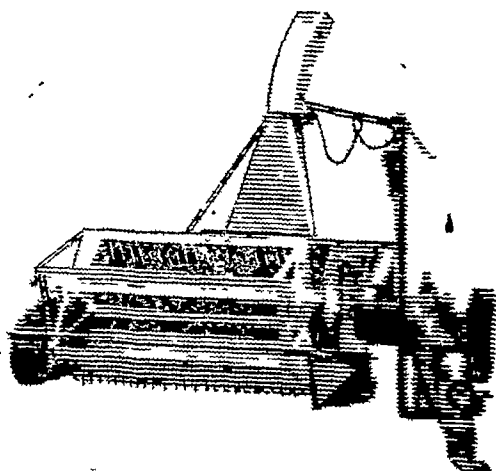

Sharpless is a Lan-Chesco Co distributor of Pro-Sil, a new liquid silage additive, in Lancaster, York, Chester and several adjacent counties.

Dr. Henderson said he spent 10 years of research with more than 5,000 beef animals to develop the complete silage additive. Thursday night's meeting, attended by about 75 local beef producers, was the kick-off meeting for sale of the product in this area, it is now available, Sharpless said.

During the meeting Dr. Henderson contended that farmers

should harvest all their corn crop in the silage form. To harvest just the corn is to throw away half the feed value of the crop, he said.

Dr. Henderson went on to explain the deficiencies in corn silage and how Pro-Sil was designed specifically to compensate for these deficiencies. He said he originally promoted urea, which most beef producers use in this area as a silage additive because it was the best thing on the market.

He continued to explain how the urea acts chemically and why Pro-Sil can perform more efficiently, giving the farmer better results at less cost.

Use of Pro-Sil in dairy operations also was discussed.
