of cooking time and turn frequently to brown evenly.

Olive Barbecue Sauce (Makes about 2½ cups) Combine ½ cup vinegar, ½ cup firmly-packed brown sugar, 1 can (12 ounces) unsweetened pineapple juice, ¾ cup catsup, 1 tablespoon soy sauce, 1 teaspoon prepared mustard and ¼ teaspoon salt. Bring to a boil, then cover and simmer 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Stir in ½ cup chopped pimiento-stuffed olives. Use as a brush on sauce on grilled chicken or as a sauce for other grilled meats.

Ayrshire Passes 100,000 Pound Production Level

Over 300 breeders and friends of registered Ayrshire dairy cattle from 25 states and Canada attended this year's 95th National Ayrshire meeting and banquet in Lancaster.

Awards for excellence in milk production and constructive breeding practices were presented to a number of Ayrshire breeders by President Dwight Knipp and David Gibson Jr., executive secretary. Masonic Homes Farms in Eliz-

abethtown, received a special 100,000 Pound Certificate for one of its older cows, Masonic Homes Mary Rose.

She qualified for this with her lifetime milk production record of 103,562 pounds of 4.1 per cent milk and 4,238 pounds of fat. In reaching this production level, she was never milked more than twice-a-day.

Also, C Harold Gable & Son, owners of Conebella Farm of Elverson, earned their 12th Constructive Breeder Award.

This award recognizes herds in which cows bred by the owner excel in milk production combined with superior body conformation. In 1969, 48 breeders qualified for this honor.

On a strictly twice-a-day milking schedule for 305 days, the cows made an annual production average of 14,066 pounds of milk and 565 pounds of butterfat. M E (Mature Equivalent). The herd has a type classification average score of 85.5 and 100

PENB Endorses UEP Program, Begins Egg Consumption Drive

"As the consumer education program of the egg industry, we are happy to put forth an all-out effort in support of the 'Action Now' program of United Egg Producers," declared the PENB Executive Committee, in a policy statement issued at its St. Louis meeting July 15.

Even with a large measure of success in effecting an industry cutback in production the last 6 months of 1970, per capita production will still range considerably above that of 1969, it was noted.

spring greatest success for the "Action Now" program. The Board will double its usual Fall effort with photograph-recipe releases to food page editors and area consumer specialists for both September and October.

In addition, 6 new stories of consumer interest will be released to the daily papers, and for those wishing to do special features on eggs, the Board is offering its file of 2,000 egg recipes and photographs and complete cooperation for those who may wish to do localized stories on the egg situation.

Cooperation by the Plentiful Foods Division of the Consumer and Marketing Service, through the Poultry Division will result in eggs being listed as a 'protein buy' in the September 'Smart Shoppers Guide'. Plentiful Foods have also received a request for additional promotional support for eggs in October.

The Board is also preparing a Fact Sheet on retail advertising of eggs, based on recent unpublished research. A letter pointing out the advisability of advertising eggs as a real 'best buy' in a rising food market along with the advertising Fact Sheet will be sent to egg merchandisers of major retail food markets. A request for cooperation on this plan has been filed with the National Association of Food Chains.

The Board is also exploring the possibilities of several special events that can result in national exposure for eggs on radio and television, as well as the printed media.

The Executive Committee and management of the Board is actively soliciting further impact promotional ideas for eggs that can be carried out within budgetary limitations.

"Just two extra egg meals per person in this 6 months can make a terrific egg price impact. But the consumer could care less about the plight of the egg industry. She has to be constantly told and sold on nutritional awareness and the economy of eggs," concluded Chairman Castner.

2 Meat Plants Closed

Two Philadelphia meat plants have been closed and charged with operating under unsanitary conditions.

The plants are the Del Packing Co. and Quality House Provisions, Inc., also known as M & M Beef Co.

Inspections by the State Agriculture Department and the Philadelphia Health Department preceded a court order closing down the plants.

Some of the alleged violations the plants are charged with include unsanitary conditions in rooms where products were handled, products exposed to dust, dirt and insects, meat stored in galvanized cans that appeared contaminated.
