Prices continued to trend lower on light type hens. Demand fair but unaggressive as processors having difficulty in clearing dressed product to canner whose current operations are centered on vegetables. Offerings though often limited are adequate for current needs. Demand for heavy type hens fair. Offerings fully adequate with occasional offerings reported to canner processors. Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens 5-7 mostly 6½-7c in Pennsylvania mostly 5-6c in New Jersey. Heavy Type Hens 11-12.

Ready-to-cook movement very active to advertised promotions; otherwise no better than fair. Advance interest fair to good. Less-than-trucklot prices unchanged to ½c higher. Live supplies fully adequate despite generally heavy slaughter schedules in most plants. Occasional processing problems limiting output in some quarters. Undertone firm though cautious in instances.

Best interest this morning centered on extra large and jumbos. Carton orders up fractionally for the balance of the week however, retail feature activity was limited in this morning's news media.

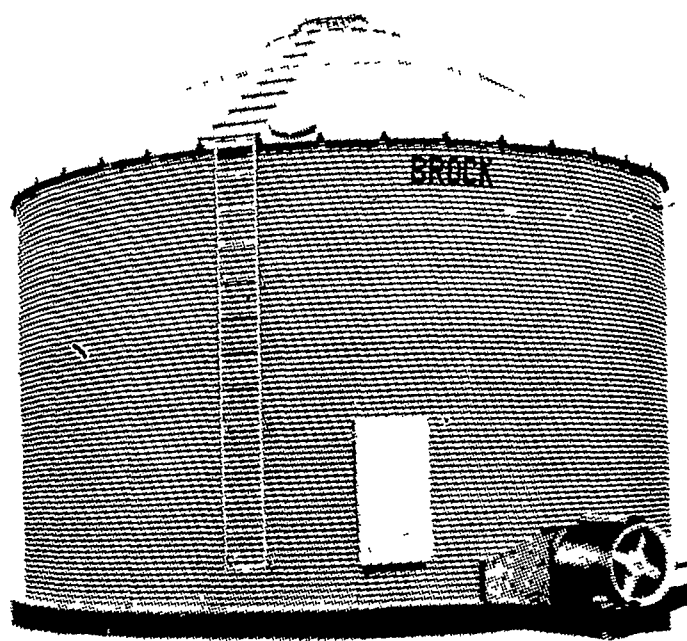

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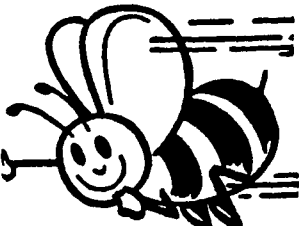
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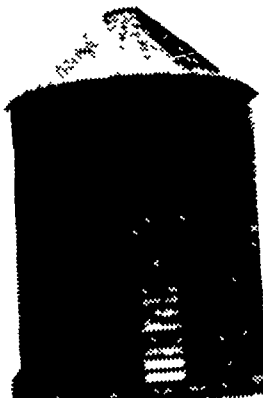
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
