## Chopped Hay Helps Livestock Coarse Pelleted Ration, 'U' Says

Adding a small amount of chopped hay to coarse pelleted rations can maintain and even increase feed consumption by cattle and sheep, a necessity for efficient weight gains, it was pointed out recently during the 62nd annual meeting of the American Society of Animal Science at Penn State.

The technique should prove profitable for operators of cattle and sheep feedlots, declared Richard F. Welton, Penn State graduate assistant in animal science

"When high concentrate rations are fed to cattle or sheep, they occasionally go off feed losing valuable time and pounds of gain. Such animals may never recover completely and may make less efficient weight gain," he affirmed.

Some 1,000 authorities in animal breeding, feeding, and management from the United States and foreign countries were at Penn State for the four-day ASAS conference.

Welton and Dr. B. R. Baumgardt at Penn State were able to show a 17 per cent increase in dry matter and digestible energy intake with sheep when 4.2 per cent of the daily diet was chopped alfalfa hay. Similar results should occur with any cud-chewing animals, it was pointed out.

The increased feed intake was observed only when chopped alfalfa hay was fed with feedlot

rations containing coarse pelleted, high concentrate rations.

Up to now, said Welton, the practice among livestock men has been to add a number of inert ingredients and roughages to all-concentrate rations to maintain feed intake. Some of the inert materials have been oyster shell, sand, and sawdust.

Chopped hay also improves the rumen or stomach environment of feedlot cattle and sheep fed high concentrate rations in pelleted form, he added.

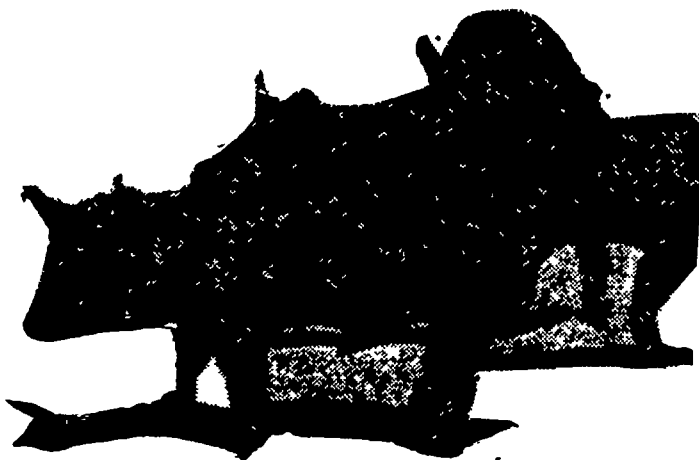

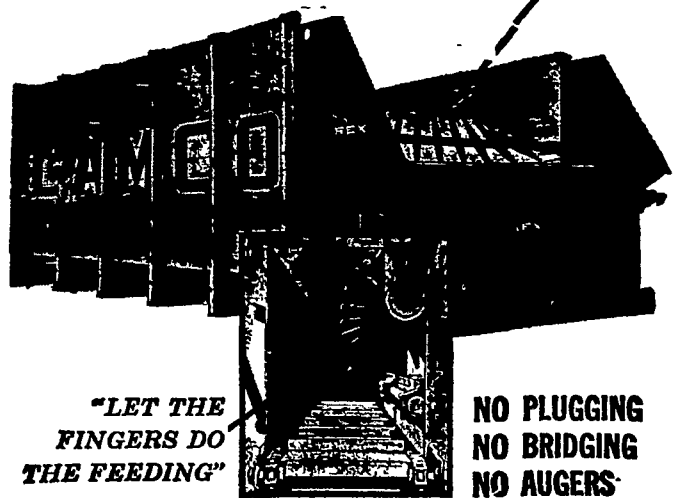
