# Lancaster County Grange Holds Picnic, Adopts Three Resolutions

Lancaster County Pomona Grange 71 held its picnic at 7 p.m. Saturday, August 22 at Holtwood Park with an attendance of 50 persons.

Plans were made to observe the fiftieth anniversary of the Lancaster County Pomona Grange at 7:30 p.m. October 10 at Fulton Grange Hall, Oakryn. National Grange Master, John W. Scott, will be the speaker. Also attending will be Mrs. Scott, A. Wayne Readinger, Mas

ter of the Pennsylvania State Grange, and Mrs. Readinger who is Ceres of the National Grange.

The special program will be in charge of the Pomona Lecturer, Mrs. Jesse Wood. Also assisting on the program committee are the Pomona officers, Mrs. Melvin C. Boyce, Mrs. Joseph Hess, Mrs. Ira Welk, Mrs. Richard Hanks and Ralph Wanner. The Pomona Women's Activities committee, Mrs. Charles Reath, Mrs. Richard Maule and Miss Helen Wanner will serve as the hospitality committee.

Pomona Master, Gyles H. Brown, conducted a short business session when the following resolutions were adopted:

(1) "WHEREAS, There is pending in the State Senate (which has already passed the House of Representatives) a bill to raise revenue by legalizing lotteries

WHEREAS The states where they are now legalized do not produce the amount of money which was anticipated

WHEREAS, Lotteries are morally wrong and take money from those least able to spend it. Therefore be it

RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona 71 go on record as opposed to the passage of a lottery bill at this session of the Legislature—or at any session in the future"

(2) "WHEREAS, There is now a plan to move the Soldiers and Sailors Monument from Penn Square in Lancaster City to Musser Park

WHEREAS, Besides being a memorial to the soldiers and sailors who died in the Civil War it also stands on a very historical spot. The first Court House in Lancaster County was built there in which was held the Continental Congress for a day and it was also the Capital of Pennsylvania for 13 years. The land on which the monument stands does not belong to the city

WHEREAS, The reason given for its removal is for safety reasons and to speed up traffic through the square. We think traffic travels too fast now and with the by-pass to the north and the one to be built soon to the south that will relieve traffic to a large degree. Therefore be it

RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona Grange 71 wishes to go on record as opposed to the moving of the monument from its present location"

(3) "WHEREAS, There is an effort being made by certain groups and individuals to change the laws pertaining to the sale of pornographic material making it legal to sell or possess such material to sell to adults. And

WHEREAS, Such legislation would only lower our moral standards without benefiting anyone. Be it

RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona Grange, meeting in regular session, goes on record as opposing any legislation that would destroy or weaken our present laws dealing with such material"

Serving on the resolution committee were Norman Wood, Richard Maule and Ralph Wanner.

Mr. and Mrs. Clifford W. Holloway Jr. were selected as alternate delegates to attend the Pennsylvania State Grange convention Oct. 26, 27, 28 and 29 at Meadville, Pa. in the event Pomona Master Brown and his wife cannot attend.

Mrs. Jesse Wood gave a report of the Pennsylvania State Grange Leadership School held at Gettysburg June 23, 24 and 25.

A donation was given to the National Grange Youth Leadership Fund.

Mrs. Jesse Wood, Misses Joyce, Peggy and Sandy Galbreath were in charge of games and Charles McSparan conducted a quort tournament.

The next regular Pomona meeting will be held at 8 p.m. Oct. 17 at Fulton Grange Hall, Oakryn.
