New York Eggs

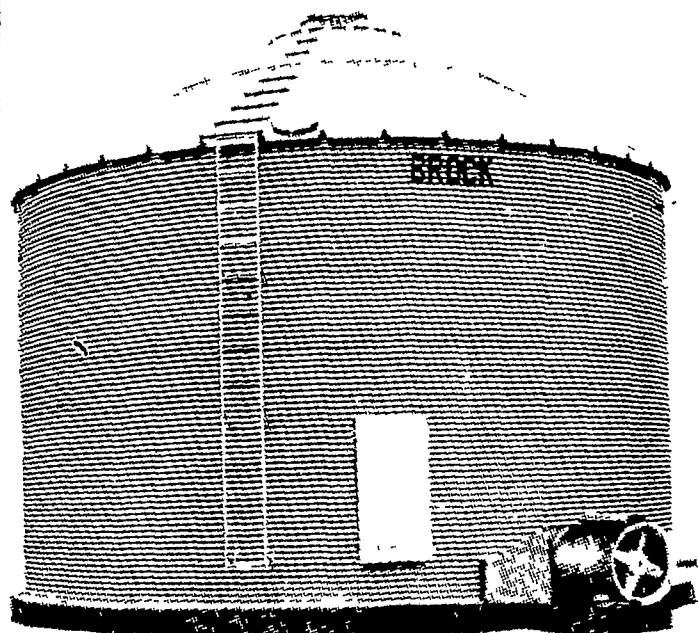

offerings as low as 30c on mediums and 19c on smalls failed to attract interest. Standards light. Rising prices and short supplies of large have tended to attract foreign eggs and this morning both Danish and Canadian eggs were being offered locally. Carton orders just far from candlers.
