

Lancaster County 4-H Youths Capture District Dairy Honors

Lancaster County 4-H members captured two breed championships and three reserve championships at the third annual South Central District 4-H Dairy Show Thursday at Harrisburg.

The two breed championship winners were:

Robert Witmer, Willow Street RD2, whose two-year-old class champion was named best Brown Swiss, and Thomas W. Aaron, Quarryville RD1, whose two-year-old champion was named best Jersey in the show.

Witmer also showed Jo-Har Thelma Nola to the senior championship, while Aaron's animal was named senior champion of the Jersey breed.

Reserve champion honors went to Aaron's sister, Barbara, who showed Jersey Blossoms Valor Emerald, to top honors in senior yearling class, and junior champion placings.

Russell Wilson, Elizabethtown, led his Ayrshire, Masonic Homes Hianna, to top placings in the two-year-old division, and reserve senior champion,

before being named to the breed reserve position.

The third breed reserve post went to Mark Z. Witmer, Willow Street RD1, whose Guernsey took top position in the three-to-four year old class and senior reserve class, before being named breed reserve.

Lancaster Countians took two first places in group competition. A Jersey breed first was captured by a team of Kathy Kreider, Barbara Aaron and

Thomas Aaron (two animals), all of Quarryville RD1. A Guernsey Breed first was won by a team of Jesse Balmer, Littitz RD4, and Mark, Peter and Susan Witmer, Willow Street RD1.

Susan Kauffman, Elizabethtown RD1, won first place in senior yearling competition before her Holstein was named junior champion.

Three Lancaster Countians with breed junior reserve championships were: Kathy Kreider, Quarryville RD1, Jersey intermediate calf winner and junior reserve champion; Lois Wanner, Narvon RD2, Brown Swiss junior calf winner and junior reserve champion, and Cheryl Balmer, Littitz RD4, Guernsey junior yearling winner and junior reserve champion.

County youths scoring class firsts in breed divisions were Terry Long, Elizabethtown, Ayrshire intermediate calf, Donna M. Akers, Quarryville RD1, Holstein junior calf, and Sandra Frey, Lancaster, intermediate Holstein calf.

Several placings within the top three positions in classes were won by county youngsters.

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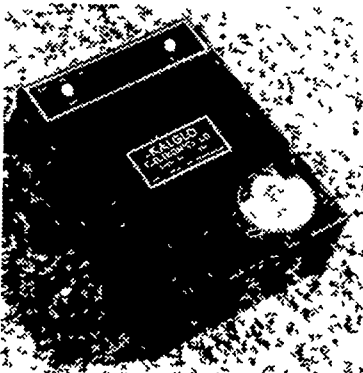


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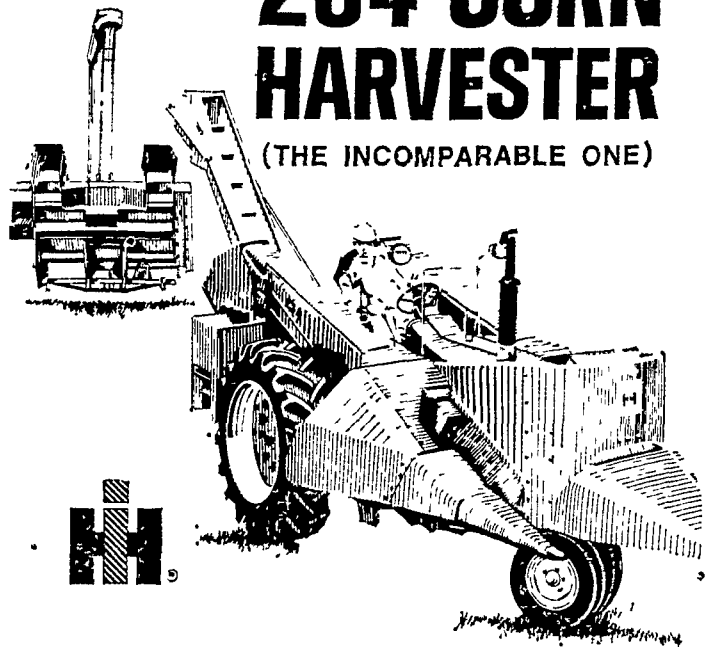
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
