

ASC Committee Candidates Named

Candidates for Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Community Committee posts in each of the 16 Communities in Lancaster County have been announced by Fred G. Seldom, ridge, chairman of the County ASC Committee.

Ballots have been mailed to all eligible farmers in the county to vote for three of six farmers they want to represent them on their Community Committee.

Ballots must be postmarked or returned to the ASCS Office by Friday, September 11. The ballots will be counted by the County ASC Committee on Monday, September 14, starting at 10:30 a.m.

The nominee who gets the most votes will be Chairman of the Community Committee. The one who gets the second most votes will be Vice Chairman and the third most votes the Regular Member. Those getting the fourth and fifth most votes will be the first and second alternate Community Committeemen.

The three elected as Community Committeemen will serve as delegates to the County Convention to elect one member and two alternates to the County ASC Committee and to choose the chairman and vice chairman. The County Convention will be held Thursday, September 24, 1970 at

8 p.m. in the Farm & Home Center.

Programs administered in the County are wheat, feed grain, cost sharing through the Agricultural Conservation Program, price support and farm storage facility loans for eligible commodities and the wool incentive payment program.

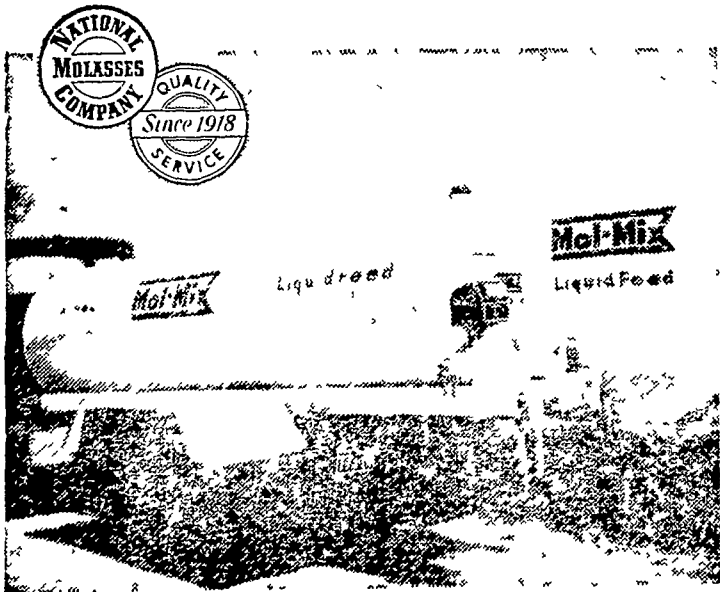

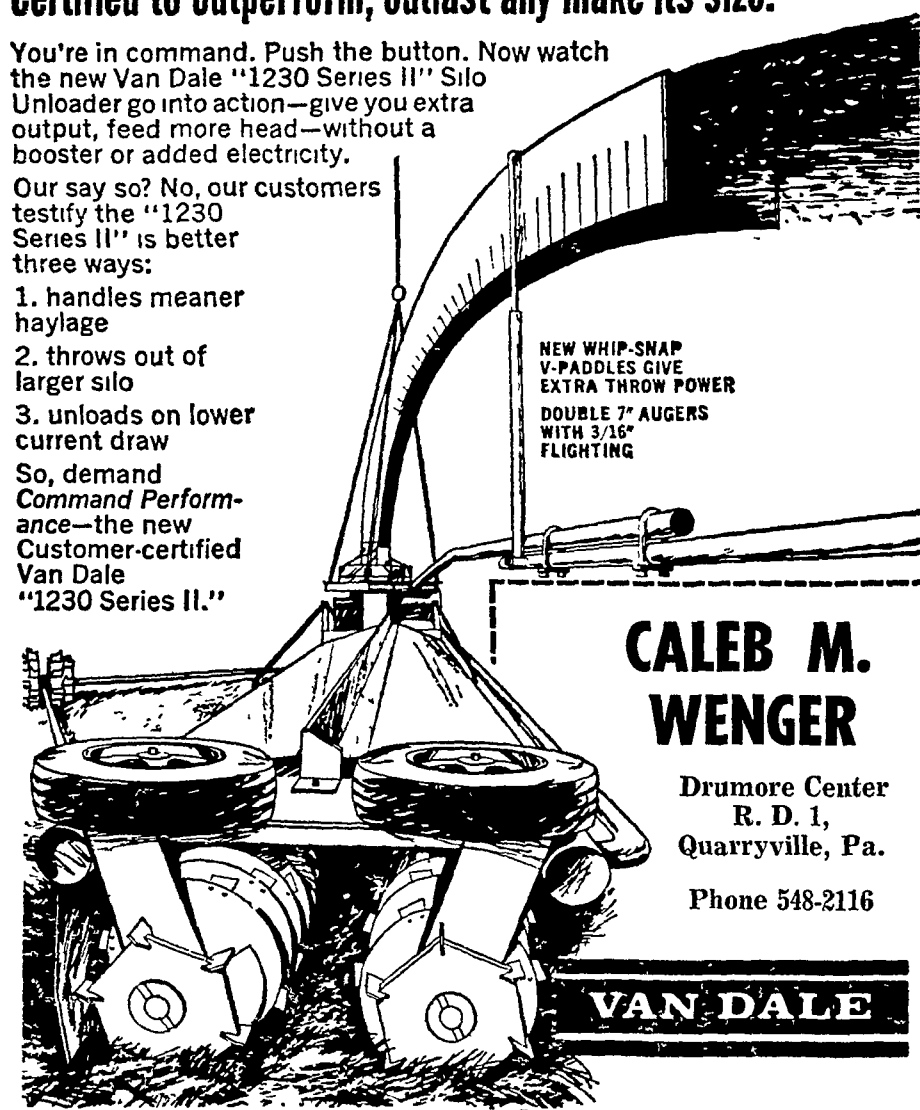
