

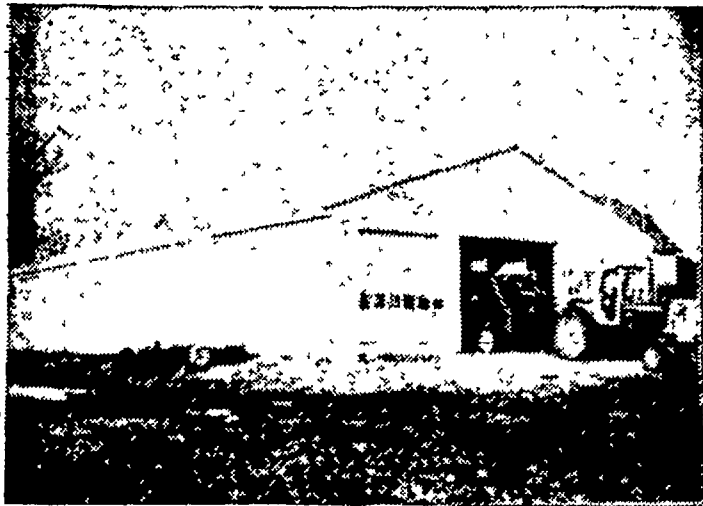
# 2,060 Enroll at 3 Vo-Tech Schools

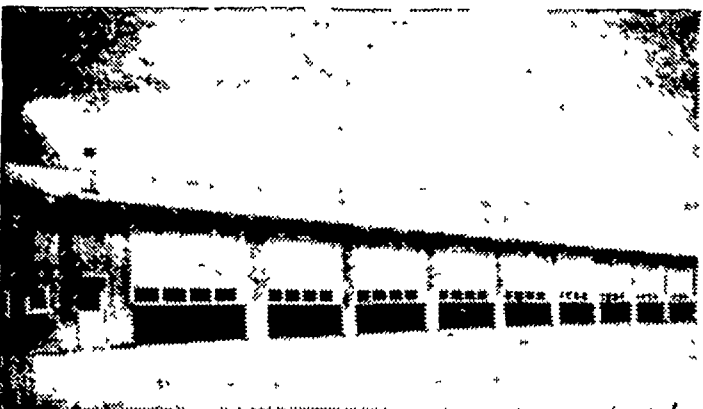

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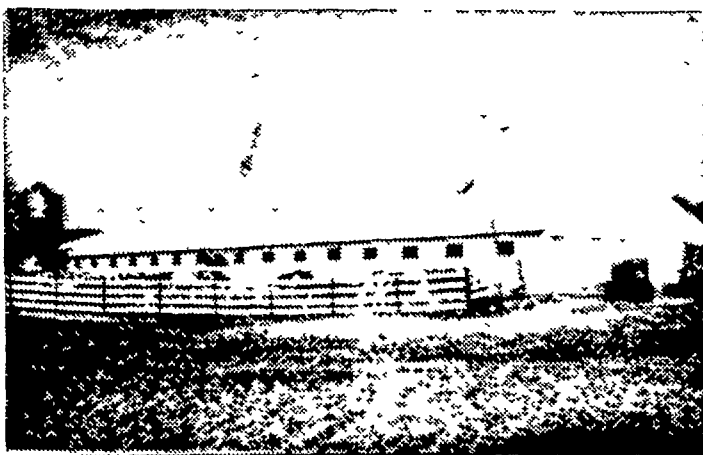
