Carton orders slow through small distributors and fan to occasionally good through the major retail outlets.

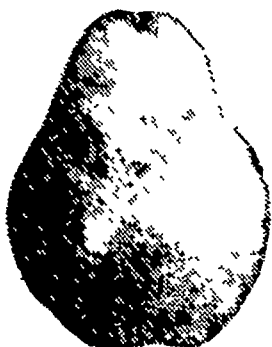

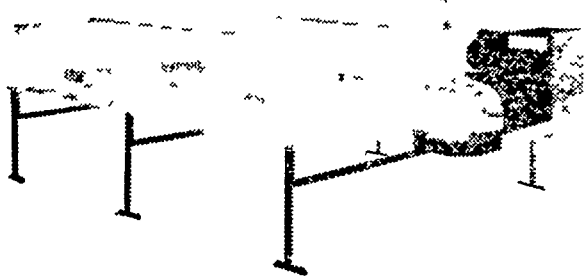

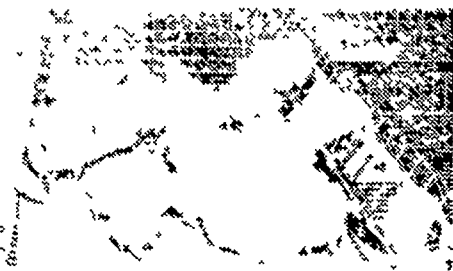
