Daily Food Guide

With children going back to school, mothers need to check out the eating habits of their children to be sure they are well nourished. Getting all the right kinds of food is important all year 'round, of course, but meals may be more flexible in the summer time.

That sound nutrition is a cog in mental and physical growth and development is strongly indicated by research. However, not everyone needs to study all the research to know what foods children need for good health.

Parents who use the "Daily Food Guide" in choosing foods can be sure they serve their children what they need. This guide provides for the foods that contain the key nutrients needed for growth and repair of the body.

Studies show that many children are poorly nourished and thus perform poorly at play and in school. Students who have an adequate breakfast also do better in mental and physical activities than those who eat a poor breakfast or none at all.

"The Daily Food Guide" is a very helpful leaflet for those who plan the meals for the family. A copy of the leaflet is free upon request from the Extension home economist.

Variety With Nuts

A new US Department of Agriculture bulletin, designed for the homemaker who likes variety in meals, tells how to use a food that is both tasty and nutritious.

Nuts which double as a cooking ingredient and as a garnish, snack, or appetizer, contribute rich flavor and crunchy texture to many combinations.

Home economists in USDA's Agricultural Research Service who prepared the new bulletin and developed the recipes, say nuts can be used as an added source of protein and food energy in the diet. Most common nuts contain about 10 to 25 per cent protein and between 45 and 70 per cent fat.

"Nuts in Family Meals. A Guide for Consumers" tells how nuts are marketed, their cost, the forms to buy, and how to distinguish good quality. There is information on storing and preparing the nuts for use.

The latest in USDA's "family meals" series gives a wide variety of recipes for main dishes, salads, soups, breads, desserts, sauces, and other nut favorites. There are also serving suggestions along with ideas for transforming familiar recipes into "company fare." All recipes give the number of calories for a specified amount of food and in some cases a variation having a lower calorie value is included.
