- 1-1/2 oz. can shrimp (can use broken)

Floating Fruit

Fruit may float in home canned products because pack is too loose or syrup is too heavy, or because some air remains in the tissues of the fruit after heating and processing.

Selecting A Dishwasher

Buy brand name appliances and equipment. A reputable manufacturer is concerned about the design, construction and servicing of his products.

Check the warranty or guarantee coverage that allows recourse should the appliance prove faulty.

Buy from a reliable dealer with competent installation personnel and available service for normal upkeep and repairs.

Read descriptive literature before buying. And be sure to read the instruction booklet before using the appliance.

Buy only appliances that meet national standards for safety. Look for the Underwriters Laboratory (UL) approval seal.

Consider which style dishwasher best suits your needs. You

choices include: portable, convertible and built-ins.

An average size dishwasher has room for 14 place settings, but the capacity varies from model to model.

Performance options include: pre-rinse, single wash, double wash, plate warming, pots and pans, and fine china, booster heating element, small disposal unit to grind waste, quiet operation, automatic detergent dispenser, compartmented silver basket, movable racks.

Electric dishwashers save time. Dishwashing is the most repeated task in the kitchen. Studies show that homemakers average 73 minutes a day on dishwashing activities done by hand, including clean-up. With a dishwasher, the average is only 35 minutes.
