

48 Voted to ASC Committee

Forty-eight Lancaster County men have been elected to positions on the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service community committee in balloting completed Monday.

Three farmers from each of 16 communities were chosen. The nominee who received the most votes in the community became chairman, the one with the second most votes, vice chairman, and the one with the third highest number of votes became a regular member.

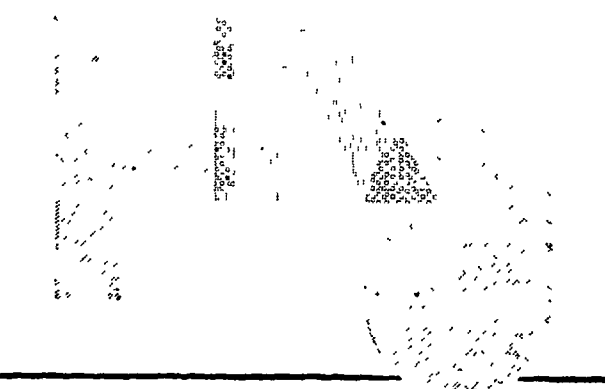
