The veteran 4-H showman moved up only one place from her good showing at Ephrata last year when she had the reserve grand champion animal, also an Angus.

Miss High also was a member of the county 4-H livestock judging team which was first in the state last year.

Holland RD1 shown to his first year finished second with the reserve grand champion honors with a Hereford. Martin's animal was judged best of breed before losing out to the Angus.

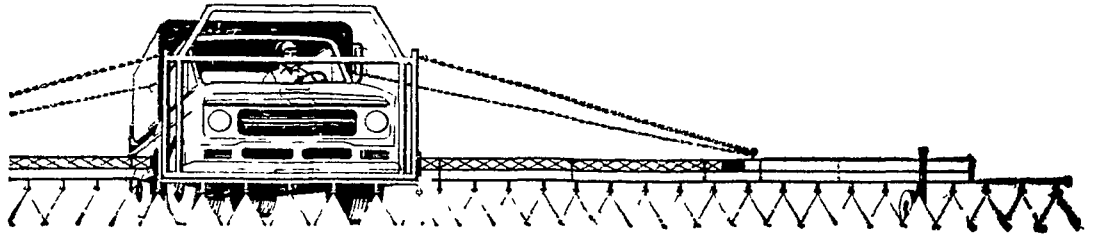
