SQUASH-TOMATO-CHEESE CASSEROLE

Special Milk Program

Secretary of Agriculture Clifford M. Hardin recently announced continuation of the Special Milk Program for the 1970-71 school year.

The Secretary said all State agencies are being notified by child-care institutions to operate the program at year-age levels through October 15, 1970, the expiration date of the Congressional "continuing resolution" under which all USDA programs are operating pending passage of the appropriations bill.

Both the Senate and the House have approved \$104 million for the Special Milk Program for the year ending June 30, 1971. The USDA appropriations bill is now awaiting action by a Senate-House Conference.

The Special Milk Program was first authorized by Congress in 1954, and provides cash subsidies to schools, childcare centers, and similar nonprofit organizations to pay part of the cost of milk served to childi en




