Jane Elizabeth Logan Is American Dairy Princess

Jane Elizabeth Logan, a prettiest 20 year-old brunette from Mount Gilead, Ohio, has been selected to reign as American Dairy Princess and representative of the American dairy farmer until July, 1971.

Jane was crowned July 1 in Boston at the 16th Annual American Dairy Princess Contest sponsored by the American Dairy Association and the Holstein-Friesian Association of America. The coronation ceremony was held in conjunction with the 85th Annual Holstein-Friesian Association banquet.

The Princess, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jack E. Logan was selected from among candidates representing 30 states. She is a blue-eyed brunette, 5'6" tall, 128 pounds and the only girl in a family of four. Her father is a dairy farmer with an 890-acre farm and a herd of 80 Holstein cows which produces 950,000 pounds of milk each year.

Jane was valedictorian of her graduating class at Gilead High School and is presently a Junior at Ohio State University, Columbus, majoring in foods and nutrition. In addition to sewing and homemaking skills acquired during nine years of 4-H Club work, she enjoys playing the flute and piano, water sports, skiing, ice skating and tennis.

Before winning the American Dairy Princess title, Miss Logan represented Ohio dairy farmers for a year as state dairy princess.

Teams From South Win All-American Judging

Teams from south of the Mason-Dixon Line won honors at the Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show invitational youth dairy cattle judging contest.

A team from the University of Maryland placed first in collegiate judging, North Carolina's entry won 4-H judging, while the FFA competition was won by a Virginia team.

In taking first place in the collegiate judging division, the University of Maryland became the second winner of the Cuthbert Nunn rotating trophy which honors the president of the Pennsylvania Dairy and Allied Industries Association. The trophy was won by Cornell University last year.

Penn State University placed second in collegiate judging and was followed by North Carolina State University, University of Kentucky, Delaware Valley College, Virginia Polytechnical Institute, Ohio State University and Cornell University.

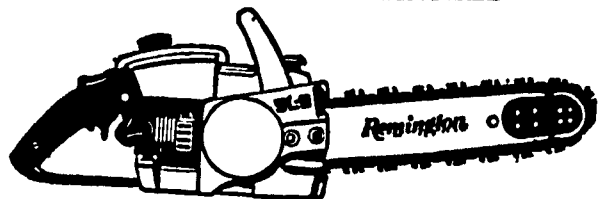
Illinois placed second in 4-H judging, followed by Kentucky, New York, Virginia, Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Hampshire, Maryland and New Jersey.

Second place in FFA judging went to a Pennsylvania team. Other winners in order were Ohio, Maryland, New York and New Jersey.

The FFA team from Virginia took top honors in Guernsey, Holstein and Jersey judging, while the University of Maryland team finished first in three breed judging competitions, Ayrshire, Brown Swiss and Holstein.

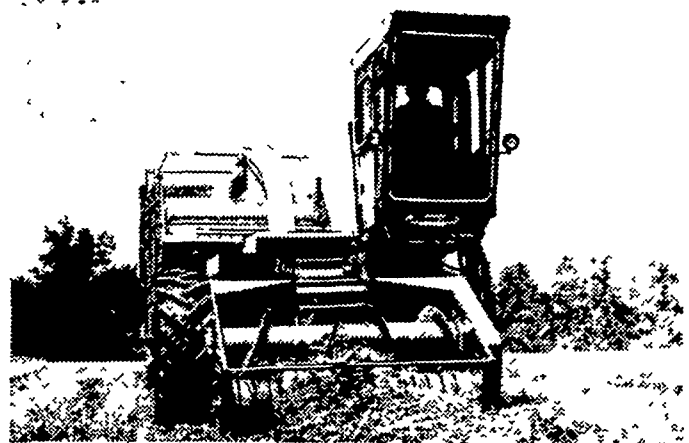
