peaches are thoroughly heated. To serve, arrange peaches on platter around meat.

When you prepare your family's summer clothing for storage, give attention to the hangers you use. They should be broad — as wide as the shoulder of the garment — and sturdy enough to carry the weight of the garment.

Shaped wooden hangers for coats and suit jackets are your best choice. They help garments hold their shape. And they're excellent for dresses, too.

Padded hangers are a good choice for lightweight garments. However, the padding must be smooth, even, and shaped for the garment if it's to do an effective job.

Store only clean garments. Wash-and-wear and durable press finishes tend to hold soil and stains. And unless soil and stains are removed, they'll set during the storage period. You'll find it difficult to remove soil and stains next summer.

You'll be wise to launder or dry clean garments you've starched before you store them. Starch will attract silverfish.

Next year when warm weather calls for bringing our light clothing, you'll be happy to find your family's summer clothing is clean and in good repair because you stored it properly.
