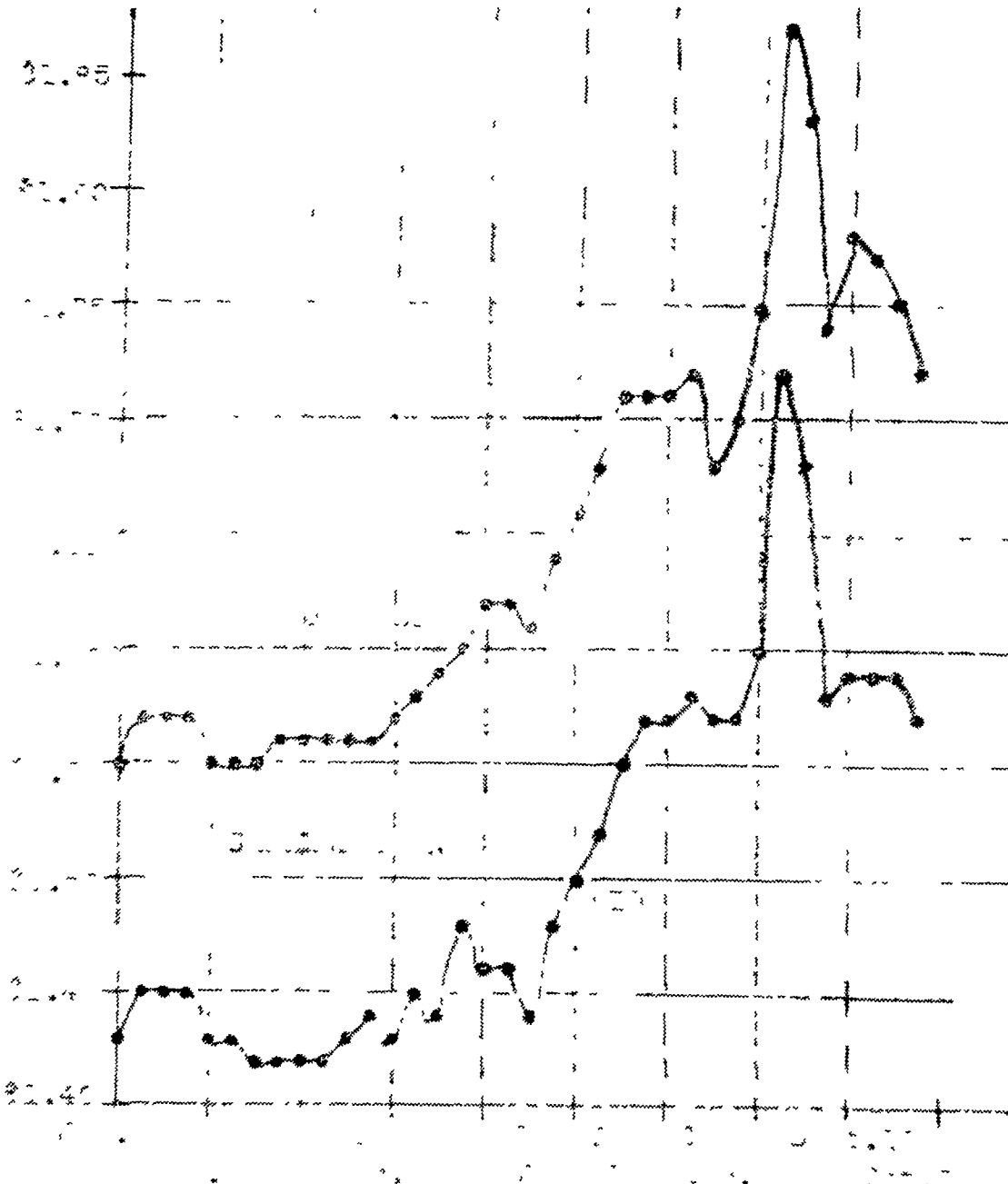

Chicago Cattle Weekly Review

CATTLE — Compared last weeks close slaughter steers and heifers steady to 25 lower. Cows and bulls steady.

Receipts 65 percent slaughter steers, 32 percent heifers, balance mainly cows. Overall finish of slaughter steers not near as attractive as last week with 10 percent prime and 75 percent choice. This compares with 16 percent prime and 72 percent choice last week and 16 percent prime and 76 percent choice last year. Average cost and weight of slaughter steers, lower at Monday's sale.
