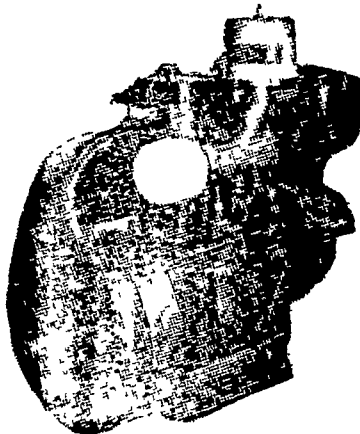

## Local 4-H Team Wins in Virginia

The Lancaster County 4-H Livestock judging team was an easy winner over four other teams Saturday at the Eastern U.S. Livestock Judging Contest at the Virginia State Fair in Richmond.

Under the direction of Max Smith, Lancaster County agricultural agent, the team consists of Gary Dean, Strasburg RD1, Burnell Buchen, Manheim RD3, Clark Stauffer, Ephrata RD1, and Ed Donough, Manheim RD1.

The three-member team and alternate placed first, fifth, sixth and seventh in individual scoring.

The three-man team score of 1,474 points out of a possible 1,650 was well ahead of state teams from Virginia, Maryland, North Carolina and South Carolina.

Dean was the contest high scorer with 505 points out of a possible 550. He was first in sheep and hog judging.

Buchen scored 486 points; Stauffer scored 483 and placed third in beef judging and Donough scored 481 points.

The local boys brought back trophies for overall scoring, high team, and firsts in hog and sheep judging.

Next competition for the team will be Nov. 12 at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition in Harrisburg, followed two days later with judging at the Eastern National Livestock Show in Timonium, Md.

The judging season will end Nov. 27 when the four boys go to Chicago and the International Fat Stock Show for competition with 4-H teams from across the nation.

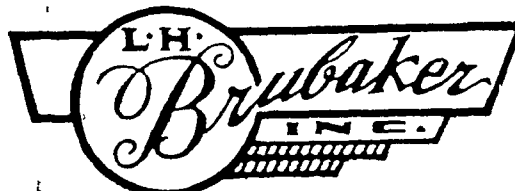
