

New Yorkers Informed Of Egg As a Good Buy

Thousands of New Yorkers are more aware today of the economical value of the eggs on the family menu, thanks to the combined efforts of two poultry industry allied firms.

Babcock Poultry Farm, Inc., Ithaca, N. Y., and Big Dutchman, Zeeland, Mich., used their combined exhibit facilities at the 1970 New York State Fair

at Syracuse as a platform to promote eggs as not only a high protein-low calorie food, but also as one of the best "buys" in the super market in relation to other foodstuffs of similar nutritional value.

Traditionally, Babcock, one of the world's foremost primary egg-type breeders, and

Big Dutchman, a worldwide distributor of egg production and processing equipment, have used the state fair exhibit to jointly display their products.

The birds, including baby chicks, pullets and layers, were on hand again this year. They were all displayed on the modern Big Dutchman equipment. But the accent was on the end product — the egg.

The two firms purchased 10,000 copies of a pamphlet extolling the economies of eggs from the Poultry and Egg National Board and distributed them to families touring the "laying house" exhibit.

In addition, several posters showing appetizing displays of egg dishes were hung around the exhibit. The posters also were obtained through PENB.



Plan Now to Plant Trees in the Spring

Farmers of Lancaster County are reminded that now is a good time to plan for tree planting to be done in the spring of 1971.

As in past years, The Glatfelter Pulp Wood Company, Spring Grove, will furnish tree seedlings free of charge to interested and qualified landowners. Since the inception of this Company program in 1951 more than 12 million seedlings have been furnished to landowners in 13 southeastern Pennsylvania counties.

Tree seedling species available this year under this program are white pine, Austrian pine, pitch pine, Norway spruce, white spruce, Japanese larch and Virginia pine. Orders are filled on a first-come, first-served basis so it is important to get orders in early.

All trees are purchased by The Glatfelter Pulp Wood Company from the Pennsylvania Depart-

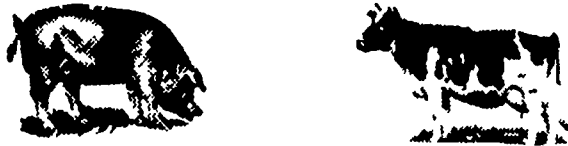
ment of Forests and Waters. The Company imposes no restriction of any kind, but landowners planting these seedlings must comply with normal state regulations regarding these trees. That is, they may not be used for Christmas trees, decorative or ornamental uses or for wind breaks. Minimum order acceptable is for 1,000 seedlings.

All trees are the property of the landowner and he may cut them at a future date for any wood product that he desires.

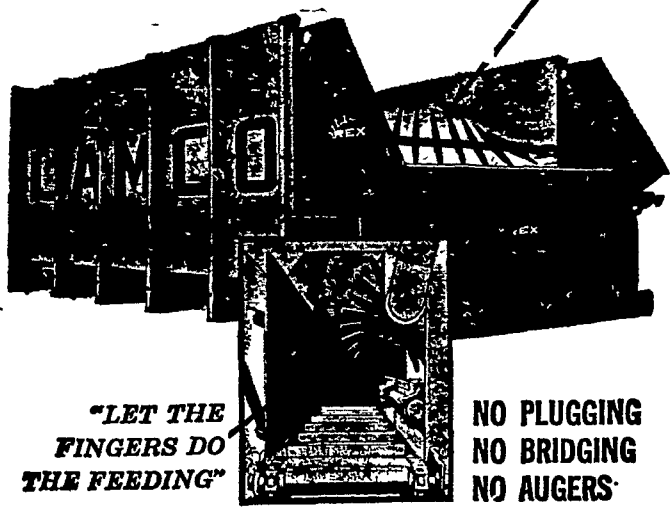

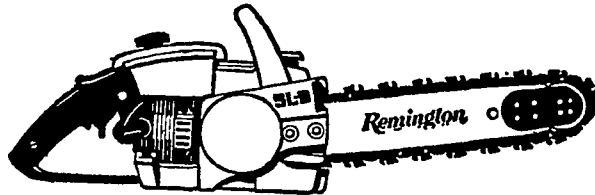
