

Pa. Ag Waste Meeting Set In Harrisburg Nov. 17-18

A Pennsylvania Conference on Agricultural Waste Management will be held in the Penn Harris Motor Inn, Harrisburg, November 17 and 18.

The program is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the College of Agriculture, Penn State University.

The program for Tuesday, November 17 begins with registration at 9 a.m., followed at 10 a.m. by Leland H. Bull, Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture, who will speak on "Why Were Here: Then Searching For Solutions" will be the topic of Dr. Russell E. Larson, Dean of the College of Agriculture at Penn State at 10:15 a.m. Pesticide and Chemical Waste in Perspective will be presented by Dr. Herbert Cole Jr., Pennsylvania State University, at 11 a.m.

Dr. Paul Hess from the Heisch Foods Corporation will speak on "A Philosophy of Pollution" at the 12 noon luncheon.

The afternoon program will feature several panel discussions beginning at 1:30 p.m. The panel will discuss "Identifying Agricultural Waste Problems"

followed at 3:30 by members of the same panel discussing "Developing and Administering Laws and Regulations on Pollution Abatement: I Can't Hear You When the Water is Running" is the theme of the dinner at 7 p.m. by Lester Willson, E. I. DuPont, DeNemours and Company representative.

Presenting at the 9 a.m. session Wednesday will be Professor Herbert Jordan of the Pennsylvania State University on "Agricultural Waste: Research Goals and Needs." Moderator at the 10:30 a.m. session is William Tipton, Pennsylvania Chamber of Commerce on "Legislative Views on Agricultural Waste Management."

Featured at the luncheon meeting at 12 noon will be "Meeting the Challenges for a Quality Environment" with Dr. Robert White Stevens, Chairman of the Bureau of Conservation and Environmental Science at Rutgers University.

The concluding session will begin at 2 p.m. with John W. Early from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture presenting "Where Do We Go From Here?"



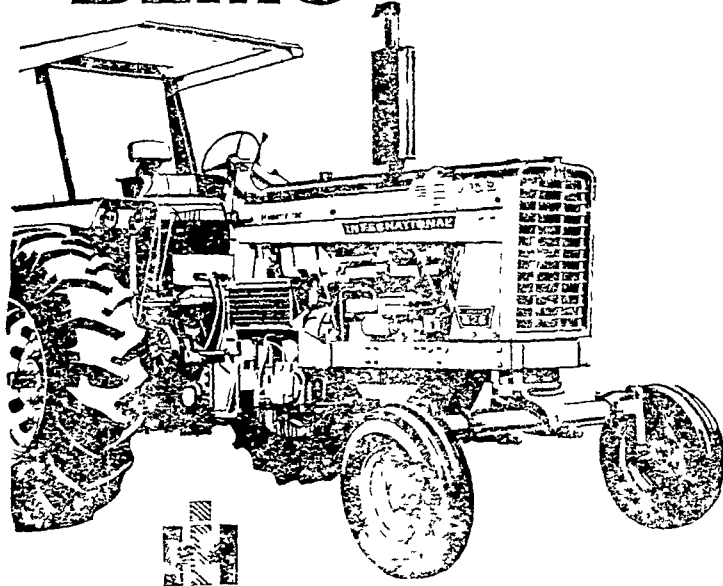

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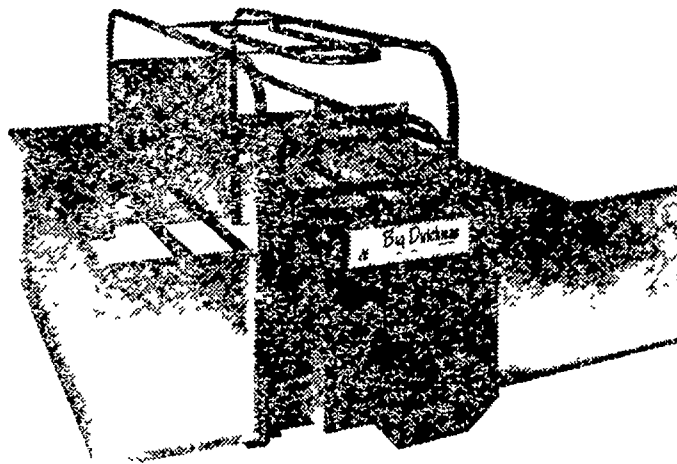
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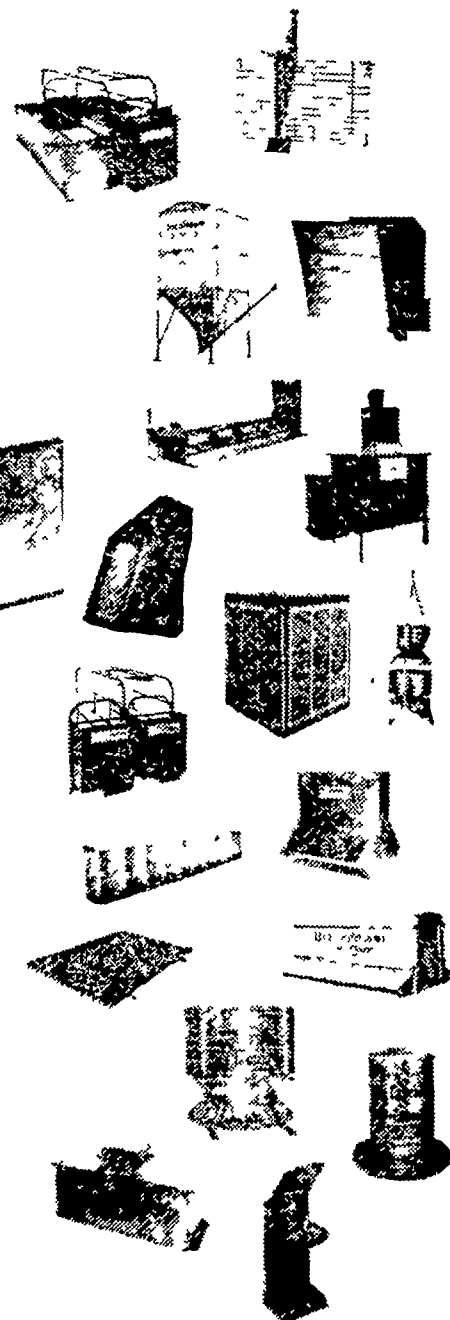
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
