National Corn Estimate Down

The US Department of Agri culture has issued a new report calling for a national coin crop for 1970 of only 4 185 billion bushels, some 13 per cent be low the July I forecast

If the latest forccast of October 2 holds through harvest, the 1970 coin crop nationally would be the lowest since 1966 and 12 per cent below the record harvest of 1967 It also would the 393 million bushels of nine per cent below last year's corn crop of 4 577 billion bushels

The new estimate calls for average yields of 722 bushels per acre compared to 839 bushels last year. The decline is attributed to the Southern Coin Blight

(Local reports, however, continue to confirm that the blight struck too late in Southeastern Pennsylvania to cause major damage and that the vields locally are good for most farm els)




