The material should be timely, it should be submitted as soon as possible after the event or well in advance of a coming event, Wilson said.

He said all material is edited for correct grammar and readability so the sender can be assured the material will come

out in a presentable form. Anyone who can't mail news should phone so that the paper's staff can check out an event, he urged, noting that good farm news coverage depends on the active support and cooperation of hundreds of individuals and organizations.

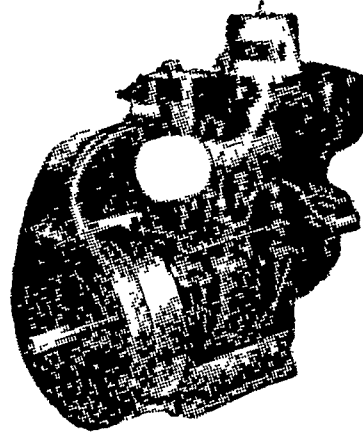
