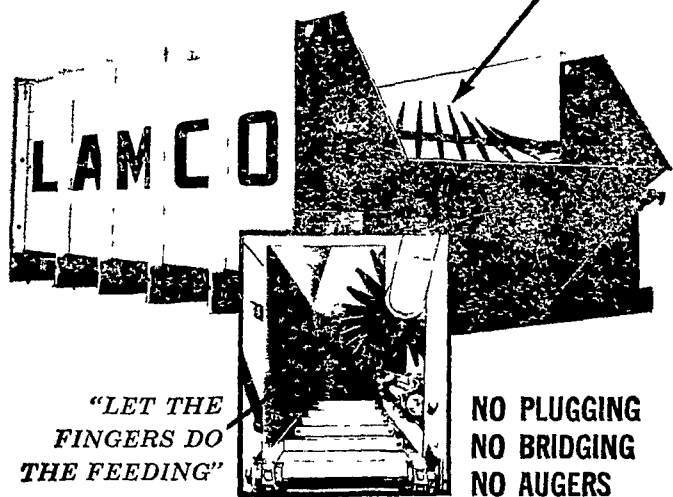

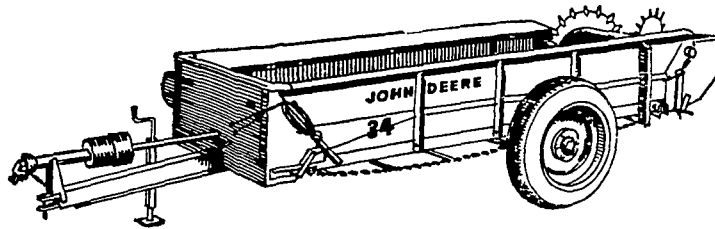

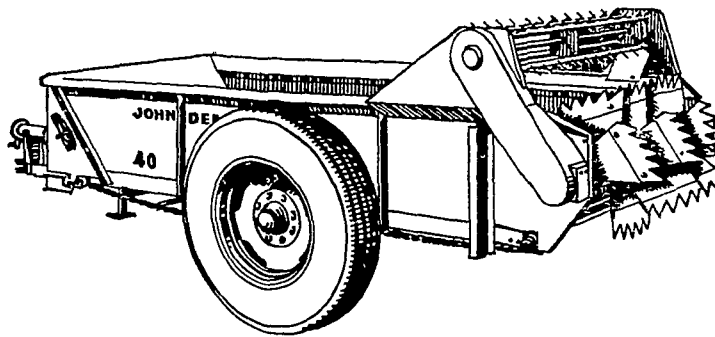

 rating.

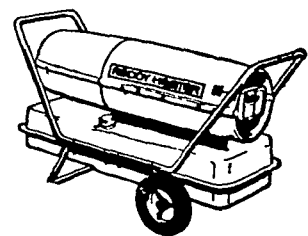
### Society 31
