

Herr Has Champion Pen at Vintage

Carl Herr, 810 Penn Grant Road, Lancaster, had the grand champion pen of five at the Vintage Sales Stables annual All-Charolais Show October 17.

The Virginia bred calves averaged 610 pounds. Four of them were bought by Earl Bate Leola for \$35.50 cwt and the other one went to Omar Beam, Elverson, for \$33.75.

Chester Stoltzfus of Glenn Moore sold the reserve champion pen of homebred Charolais-Hereford crossbreds. The 495

pound animals sold individually for \$36 to 41.50.

David Nolt of Peach Bottom RD2 exhibited the third place Charolais pen. Averaging 635 pounds, the five animals sold for \$30.75 cwt.

Judge for the show was James L. Anderson, U.S. Department of Agriculture market news reporter, Lancaster. A total of 247 head of both show entries and additional Charolais stockers and feeders sold at outstanding prices during the evening auction.

Among buyers were six Manheim FFA members who bought seven animals. These animals will be raised as projects during the coming year until the Manheim Farm Show and Sale which will be held in October 1971. Buyers included Martin Becker, Tony Haldeman, Dennis Lehman, Ken Longenecker, Jerry Miller, and Donald Wenger, paying \$38 to 42.
