Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens 4 5/4 mostly 5-5 1/4c in Pennsylvania, mostly 4 4 1/2c in New Jersey. Heavy Type Hens 7-9c.

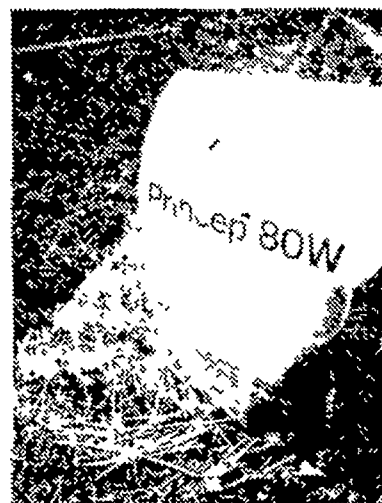
