### UEP Action Now Project Deemed Partial Success

While the Action Now program sponsored by United Egg Producers is having a "substantial impact on the egg industry," according to Jerry Faulkner, UEP general manager, "the economic outlook for the industry in the immediate future is still extremely poor."

He explained, "Our nationwide program of industry restraint, while not 100 per cent

effective, has accomplished far more than the many highly vocal critics of the program ever believed possible. We have proved conclusively that positive results can be obtained through voluntary cooperative action on a nationwide basis."

Faulkner pointed to the August egg type hatch reduction of 23 per cent and the reduction of eggs in incubators as of September 1 as positive proof of the program's effectiveness. He noted that the program's success had caused other commodity groups to wonder if they could benefit in the same way. The broiler people, for example, have started action to form a similar nationwide cooperative in an effort to bring stability to their industry.

Faulkner announced that United's executive committee and board of directors would meet in Atlanta on October 22 and 23. He said that a follow-up to the Action Now program would be discussed.
