

Angus Breeders Register 350,000

For the seventh year in a row Angus cattlemen registered more than 350,000 purebred black, hornless calves according to a recent announcement by Lloyd D. Miller, executive secretary of the American Angus Association, St. Joseph, Missouri.

He reported Angus registrations in the organization's fiscal year ended September 30, numbered 352,471. They were re-

ceived from all 50 states and five other countries. The 1970 Angus total again was higher than the number of registrations reported by any other beef breed, either horned or polled.

The most encouraging part of the 1970 results, Miller said, was the greater number of calves processed in the Association's Angus Heifer Improvement Record program. "In 1970 a total of 42,228 calves were weighed and graded at weaning age," he explained, "and this was up 16.7 per cent over the 1969 total. In addition nearly 15,000 yearlings were weighed at either 12 or 18 months of age and scored for correct type. This was an increase of 16.3 per cent over last year."
