between the regions. The Federation has fought the percentage increase and this year's 20 helped set a partial adjustment between the Northeast and Southern freight rates.

In recent weeks the railroad industry has been seeking another percentage rate increase.

In other activities the Federation is represented on the NEPPCO board through which it participates in national issues.

The Federation has formalized its members with the policies of United Egg Producers (UEP). Donald E. Horn is on the long range planning program of UEP.

The Pennsylvania Egg Marketing Association is also an affiliated organization. The Association formed and operates an egg exchange that helps maintain orderly marketing of Pennsylvania produced eggs.

The Pennsylvania Poultry Processors Association is another affiliate. The Processors keep informed on state and federal regulations and try to insure reasonable inspection standards.

The Federation has helped inform farmers of the details of the spent hen program of the Pennsylvania Farmers Association.

The Federation each year gives a scholarship of \$500 to a worthy Penn State student.
