In other action, federal hog cholera indemnity regulations Under Federal indemnity reg- value of the swine destroyed, ac- USDA to pay half the costs of swine infected with or exposed

> Previously, the Department did not pay for the transportation, burial, incineration, or other expenses incurred in connection with the depopulation of infected or exposed herds

The regulation change also permits the Department to pay for the care and feeding of swine held for destruction However, such expenses are deducted from the appraised value of the swine prior to computing the indemnity payment due the owner

The change was made to facili tate the prompt depopulation of infected and exposed herds Occasionally, owners have had difficulty in arranging for burial equipment or for trucks to take animals to the rendering plant This delays depopulation and risks spread of the disease, ARS

All but three States-Arizona Maine, and New York - are engaged in final stamping out activities against hog cholera In these States all infected and exposed herds are eliminated, with indemnity payments to help compensate owners for their


