CATTLE — Compared last Friday slaughter steers and heifers steady to strong cows and bulls steady.

Receipts 75 percent slaughter steers 22 percent heifers balance mainly cows. Overall finish of slaughter steers the same as last week with 17 percent prime and 77 percent choice. This compares with 12 percent prime and 82 percent choice last year. Average cost and weight of slaughter steers estimated at 2165 and 1145 lbs compared with 2863 and 1159 lbs last week and 2856 and 1160 lbs last year. Heifer supply mainly high good to low prime weighing 850-1050 lbs.
