Food Assistance Added For Five Million in Year

Nourishing food has been provided to more Americans this year than at any time in history. Secretary of Agriculture Clifford M. Hardin stated in a Thanksgiving message.

Food assistance programs serve more than 12 million of the Nation's poverty victims, a gain of five million since last Thanksgiving, Secretary Hardin said, and child feeding programs now reach far more schools and related institutions.

America's food supply, "unequaled in abundance and quality anywhere on earth," has expanded 20 per cent in the past decade and makes it possible for the Nation to "share with those less fortunate the vast bounty from farms, fields and ranches," the Secretary said.

"But while benefitting from the farmer's output, we should strive to raise the economic level of the farmer to that of his fellow citizens in other walks of life," Secretary Hardin said. He expressed the opinion that the new farm law just passed by Congress marks steps in that direction by moving toward market-oriented production and expanded exports.

Frozen Poultry Supply

November 1 stocks of frozen poultry, reflecting increases in every category, soared above year-earlier levels, the U. S. Department of Agriculture reported.

A total of 619,572,000 pounds of frozen poultry was in storage, compared with the year-earlier figure of 538,804,000 pounds.

Broiler-fryer holdings totaled 34,296,000 pounds, compared with 19,735,000 pounds, roasters were 10,873,000 pounds, compared with 6,699,000 pounds, hens (fowl) totaled 55,432,000 pounds, compared with 28,601,000 pounds, turkeys were listed at 442,759,000 pounds, compared with 435,620,000 pounds, ducks were 10,603,000 pounds, compared to 7,184,000 pounds, and unclassified totaled 65,609,000 pounds, compared with 40,965,000 pounds.
