(Continued from Page 14) place to put it. This will be the third cutting and we should get about three more Hay prices have been \$20 to \$25 a ton lately, so if it can be stored it always about doubles in price during the winter.

I have 27 cows and 30 calves

on the farm now. The Charolais semen finally arrived from England about November 15 and we have started on our breeding program Only four cows have been inseminated thus far, so the progress is very slow.

Beef and pork prices are holding up very well and are

both in about the 30 cents per pound (dressed weight) bracket.

The sheep men seem to be having a very tough struggle and many are trying to swing to cattle raising Sheep numbers have dropped sharply in Queensland but in spite of the drought cattle numbers have increased the last few years

In fact, some of the meat works near here have been shipping cattle from South Australia to meet their killing requirements

Americans Visit

Quite a few American families got together for a Thanksgiving dinner again this year here in Toowoomba There were about 50 present from 10 different states The largest number was from Georgia and California

We have had three visitors from Lancaster County since we live here

The last was a Mrs Mary Martin from Elizabethtown only about two weeks ago She seemed to enjoy seeing this part of Australia.

It will be managing a small export business shipping the finished product to the U S
