



USDA Views Tighter Beef Carcass Inspection

The U S Department of Agriculture announced recently an extension of time until Jan 8, 1971 for public comment on its proposal to tighten meat inspection regulations affecting beef carcasses that show evidence of tapeworm infection

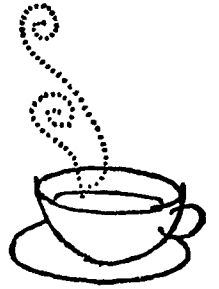
The original deadline for comments on the measure was Dec 7. The extension provides for an additional 30 days for interested persons to state their views. USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service said the extension was made because of requests for extra time.

Two copies of any comment should be sent by Jan 8 to the Hearing Clerk, U S Department of Agriculture, Washington, D C 20250. All comments will be available for public review. The proposal was originally published in the Nov 7 Federal Register, and publication of the extension notice will appear in the Dec 9 Federal Register.

Copies of the proposed amendment are available from the Consumer Protection Programs Services Staff, Consumer and Marketing Service, U S Department of Agriculture, Washington, D C 20250.

Get The Most From Your Dryer

If you have a clothes dryer, it's probably getting a real workout this winter. But are you getting the most from this handy appliance?

Here are some tips on the extra tasks a dryer can do for you.

First of all, it can steam out wrinkles in wool, rayon, or gabardine clothing. Just place the clothing in the dryer with two damp towels and tumble dry for about five minutes.

When your children come in from playing in the snow, you can dry their snow suits quickly in your dryer and have them toasty-warm for another trip outside.

If you squeeze the extra moisture out of feather pillows, you can have them dry in 12-to-18 minutes in your dryer. However, do not dry pillows containing foam rubber in a dryer.

Some clothing and household washables will need little or no ironing if you under-dry them.

For instance, cotton sheets will dry "hospital tight" if you remove them from the dryer before they're completely dry and place them on the bed immediately. Permanent press shirts and blouses will emerge nearly wrinkle-free if you don't overcrowd them in the dryer. Remove them when damp-dry and air-dry them to finish, then touch up cuffs and collar with an iron, if necessary.

Corduroy fabrics should be removed while they still have a

hint of dampness. Then, use a buffer load of towels to raise the nap to a like-new finish.

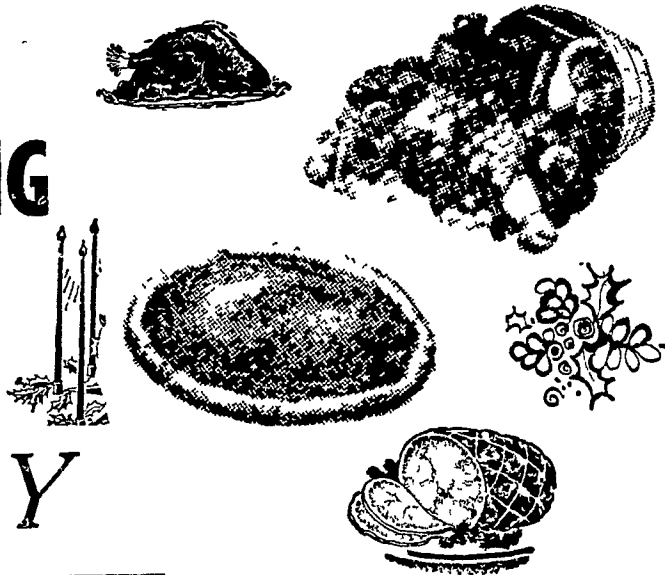
