If you have a clothes dryer, it's probably getting a real workested persons to state then out this winter. But are you getting the most from this handy

Here are some tips on the extra tasks a

First of all, it can steam out wrinkles in wool, layon, or gabardine clotning Just place the clothing in the diver with two damp towels and tumble dry for about five minutes

When your children come in from playing in the snow, you can dry their snow suits quickly in your dryer and have them toasty-waim for another trip outside

If you squeeze the extra moisture out of feather pillows, you can have them diy in 12to-18 minutes in your diver However, do not dry pillows containing foam rubber in a dryer

Some clothing and household washables


