

Fertilizer Meeting

The annual meeting of The Fertilizer Institute, normally held in mid-June, will be moved to the Palmer House, Chicago, Feb. 9-10, 1971, "in order to accommodate an expanded mem-

bership." Institute President Edwin M. Wheeler announced today The Midwest Fertilizer Conference, usually held in February, will be a part of the Annual Meeting.

The two-day program will be preceded on Feb. 8 with a series of meetings of Institute committees, and midwestern university representatives.

The previous annual meeting date and location—June 13-16, 1971, The Greenbrier, White Sulphur Springs, W. Va.—has been reserved for the Institute's 1st Annual Fertilizer Marketing Conference.

L. H. Brubaker To Separate Two Stores

Plans are being made to separate the ownership and operation of L. H. Brubaker's two stores. The store at Lititz RD3 will be operated by Mr. and Mrs. Roy A. Brubaker. No change will be made at the Lancaster Store.

Annual County Tobacco Show Planned Thursday

The annual Lancaster County Tobacco Show will be held Thursday (Jan. 7) at the Farm and Home Center.

FFA entries are due from 10 to 11:30 a.m. and adult entries are due from 12 noon to 1:30 p.m. The judging will begin at 1:30 p.m. Ribbons and cash prizes will be awarded.

(Note: Because of early publication deadlines this week due to the New Year holiday, Lancaster Farming was unable to

cover the 4-H Tobacco Show and Coin Exhibit Thursday afternoon and this event will be covered along with the county show in next week's Farm Show Issue.)

Arnold G. Lueck, associate Lancaster County agricultural agent, said the classes at the Thursday show will be the same as for the State Farm Show and are as follows:

Class I, Wrapper B's—Division A, long wrappers over 26 inches, and Division B, short wrappers 26 inches and under.

Class II, Filler B's—Division A, long fillers over 26 inches, and Division B, short fillers 26 inches and under.

Class III, Binder Type—Division A, long binders over 26 inches, and Division B, short binders 26 inches and under.

Class VI, FFA Wrappers—C1, no length specified.

Class VII, FFA Fillers—C2, no length specified.

All exhibits entered in the county show will be taken to the Farm Show, unless the exhibitor requests otherwise.

Growers not able to bring their tobacco to the county show, but who desire to exhibit at the Farm Show, may bring the tobacco to the Farm and Home Center by Friday (Jan. 8). The Extension agents will arrange to get it to the Farm Show Building. But Lueck cautioned growers to be sure the tobacco is well wrapped to prevent drying out.

New York Meat Inspection

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently certified the New York meat inspection program equal to the Federal one, under provisions of the Wholesome Meat Act.

As a result, New York now has full responsibility for inspection of meat slaughtering and processing plants doing business wholly within the State. The certification will affect 692 intrastate plants now operating there.

Meat Inspection Reinstated

The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced recently that Federal meat inspection has been reinstated at Medallion Provision Inc., 1933 Reed St., Philadelphia.


USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service said that plant management has agreed to abide by Federal inspection requirements.

Inspection service had been suspended when the plant was found to be operating under unsanitary conditions, C&MS officials said.


