Underpass Will Help

A seldom used underpass will see plenty of action during the 1971 Pennsylvania Farm Show which opens in Harrisburg Monday.

Horace L. Mann, Farm Show director, said chartered buses will discharge passengers at the entrance of the underpass on North Cameron Street.

"Passengers will be able to scoot underneath the heavily traveled street," Mann said. "They'll be safe and won't have a long walk to the Show buildings."

After unloading their passengers, the buses will park at a site a mile away from the Show.

Mann said bus drivers will be transported to and from their buses and the Farm Show complex.

Farm Show Entries

The Farm Show complex at Harrisburg will be bulging at the seams with animals next week, the week of the 55th annual Pennsylvania Farm Show.

Horace L. Mann, Farm Show director, said there are 2,240 animal entries and 2,318 poultry entries.

Animal entries are 738 beef cattle, 308 swine, 479 sheep, 79 horses and 636 dairy cattle.

Poultry entries are 1,052 large fowl, 941 bantams, 182 ducks, 80 geese, 38 turkeys, and 25 4-H - Vocational fowl.
