The Holstein Friesian Association of America recently announced that it has received 13 new members from Lancaster County.

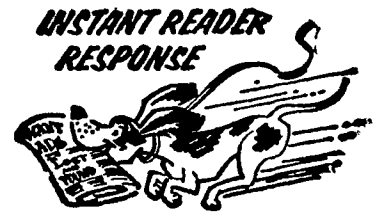

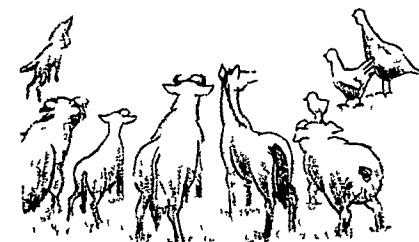

Price Increases

With the prices of nearly everything on the increase, the question is posed about the value of farm real estate. We are informed by our economists that nationally, the value of farm real estate rose another 4% during the past year; this is the smallest rate advance in the past seven years and could be due to the tight money situation throughout the country. While market values declined in some of the mid-western states, they were up sharply in the east including Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Maryland. In Pennsylvania the value of the average acre of farm real estate is 14% higher than a year ago. Cash rent for pasturing livestock averaged \$3.00 per month in the northeast and the average cash rent per acre for crop land was \$22.35. These prices will vary according to the fertility of the land and production capacity.
