Harold Neigh, Consumer Economics Specialist of the Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension Service will present slides and conduct discussion to help homemakers become more familiar with the supermarket and its facilities on Tuesday, February 2 at 7:30 p.m. in the Extension Training Center in the Farm and Home Center.

Neigh has been a member of Cooperative Extension Service staff of The Pennsylvania State University since July, 1956. Prior to his appointment to the University campus staff, he was Southwest Area Marketing Agent for three years with offices in Pittsburgh.

A native of Dayton, he prepared for college at Dayton Vocational High School and earned a bachelor of science degree in horticulture from Penn State in 1950. He also received his master of science degree in agricultural economics from Penn State.

Prior to his appointment to the Penn State staff, he was employed as a marketing specialist by the Agricultural Marketing Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture for six years.
