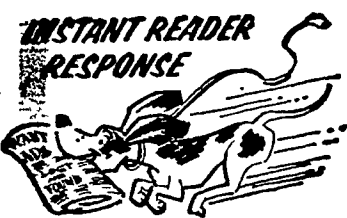

Master of ceremonies was Robert C. Groff, Camaigo, president of the Quarryville district.

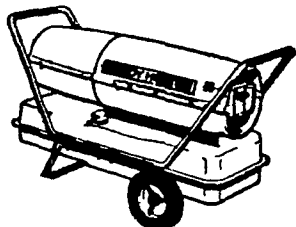
Ray Kreider, who is president of the Southern Lancaster local, had the invocation. Mrs. Robert Wagner, Little Britain, sang a solo.
